## 2021 Grants

## Rebecca Ahn Visual Artist - Peter Godwin Award

Rebecca, from Tumbi Umbi, has enrolled at UNSW for a degree in Visual Arts with a view to becoming an art teacher. She will use her grant to purchase art materials, digital art technology and for tuition fees.

#### Ruby Archer Singer Songwriter - Narelle Jones Memorial Award

This is Ruby's second BFA award and she is still only 16 years old. She is about to complete her first EP, "Camomile Tea", which will be released in early 2022.

#### Jacinta-Rose Burley Musical Theatre

This is the third BFA grant for Jacinta-Rose, from Bluehaven. Although trained as a musical theatre performer, she is interested in all aspects of theatrical production and sees her future in that industry.

## Jessica Cameron Singer Songwriter

Jess, whose stage name is "Mindy Lou", has already enjoyed success after being 'discovered' by the Triple J "unearthed" program. She will use her grant to purchase high-quality recording equipment, and recording studio time which will firmly establish her as a positive force in the music industry.

### **Ebony De Luca Popular Singer**

24-year old Ebony performs as "Eluera" and she has received over 1 millions "hits" of her songs on the music streaming service, Her song "Moderation has been played three times by Elton John on his podcast.

#### **Brandon Duff** Singer Songwriter

A dedicated singer/songwriter and music producer, Brandon will use his grant to work with Grove Studios and will use his grant to seek professional promotion support to expand his following.

## **Kelly Griffith** Singer Songwriter

From Terrigal, Kelly performs as "Elaskia" and her songs have been featured in the American TV series "Dynasty", Marvels "Runaways", and the Australian show "Home and Away".

#### Lilia Jackson Art Curator - Coles-Danziger Award

Pandemic restrictions initially delayed Lilia, from Point Frederick, travelling to London to pursue her postgraduate studies in art curatorship but, with her second BFA grant, she is now fully immersed in those studies.

#### Mele Kafusi Classical Soprano

Mele, an Opera singer from the Central Coast has performed in several regional Opera companies. Originally from Tonga, she loves the scope of Opera and performing both here and in greater Sydney. Her grant will meet some of her tuition costs for vocal lessons.

# - Charrington -McBride Award

Zali, of Phegans Bay, is currently studying at NIDA, having done important preparatory work at University of Sydney and achieved high distinctions during her High School years. She aspires to theatrical prop design, and her grant will help her fund both equipment and software for prop design.

# Ryan Lee Cinemaphotographer - J&M Adams Award

Ryan, a cinematography and experimental documentary film-maker, is passionate about making films that push positive agendas involving the conservation and sustainability of nature and the environment, and documenting and sharing cultural Indigenous knowledge. This grant will contribute to the cost of purchasing a special, infrared camera.

# Jack Li Marimba player - Lynden Gallagher Award

Jack Li, from Terrigal, is a highly talented Marimba player who has performed with two of the Central Coast's most important orchestras. He will use this grant to fund an extension to his Marimba's range down to the lowest register, where many Marimba composers require access.

#### Riley Lovell Singer Songwriter

Riley has been supported by BFA through grants of assistance for the past five years as he has demonstrated his growth and musical development. He is continuing his studies at the Sydney Conservatorium as he pursues his ambition to build a life in music.

# Kani Lukuta Singer Songwriter - Graeme Anderson Award for Excellence

At only 15 years old this multi-talented musician with facility in guitar, mouth organ, piano, and other instruments impresses with his seriously funny, self-composed comic songs. He will use his grant to purchase good instruments, and to produce a comedy album and act in more live performances.

#### Joshua Maxwell Playright - John & Anna Bell Encouragement Award

Josh is a true young theatrical innovator on the Central Coast. The founder of the Central Coast youth arts company, Jopuka Productions, he has been the 2020 Arts & Culture Citizen of the Year and 2021Central Cost Volunteer of the Year. He will use his grant to complete the next stage in a major writing work.

#### Andrew Mencken Poet - Allen & Unwin Award for Creative Writing

Andrew is a 28 year-old poet from Budgewoi who is pursuing his PhD in English literature at Newcastle University. His poetry is intimately evocative of the landscape and people of the Central Coast. He will use his grant to fund the publication of his poems, as well as attendance at regional writing conferences

#### Harry Moulston Singer Songwtiter

A singer/songwriter, Harry is also a trombonist/teacher who conducts one of his bands. His debut full length "Boomer Ballads" was released mid year. The BFA grant will be invested in mastering costs, and permit him to do more collaborative work to produce more recordings.

#### Ashleigh Mounser Writer

One of BFA's first Awardees in 2012, Ashleigh will use her third BFA grant to buy that essential writer's tool, a new laptop. A creative Writing graduate from the University of Woollongong, she has studied scriptwriting at University of Miami and the Australian School of Film, Television and Radio. She is working towards publication of two novels.

## Tayla Needham Writer

A 21 year-old writer from Gosford, Tayla has achieved huge success at the University of Newcastle, lately in a leadership role at the UON writer's club in a variety of key roles. The BFA grant will help her create a website domain, publish works, and attend workshops.

#### **Emma Rose Pinsent** Visual Artist

Emma is a visual artist with a particular interest in print-making. She will use the BFA grant for the cost of photography in conjunction with a planned exhibition of her work.

#### Ella Powell Singer Songwriter

Ella is a hugely talented young singer/songwriter principally in the country/pop genre and this is her second BFA grant. She has recently recorded an original single recording/video which will be released early in 2022.

#### David Ramsden Visual Artist

Working mainly in oils, David used his previous BFA grant to fund his participation in numerous exhibitions in NSW and Victoria. This grant will be used to complete and transport paintings to a solo exhibition with the Brunswick Gallery in Victoria.
